Runaway Shelter/Transitional Living Program

The shelter provides 24-hour supervision, room and board for clients from ages 12 to 17. The main goal of the shelter is to provide case management services, and permanent placement in an appropriate facility or home for youth that are misplaced due to situations ranging from family crisis to homelessness. While at the shelter, the youth are expected to continue to attend school or the equivalent through their Chapter One and Project Link programs. Comprehensive networking with various agencies assures that the youth will be successfully placed and will have the greatest chance of achieving their goals.

In addition to shelter services, a transitional living program is available to persons 16-21 years of age. Persons 16-17 will start the program at the shelter then move into apartments. Persons 18-21 will start the program in apartments. During the program, clients will develop independent living skills through instruction by program staff. Upon completion of the program, the clients will have the knowledge and skills to live on their own.

Children's Safehouse of Las Cruces

The mission of the Children's Safehouse is to reduce trauma to children and their families by promoting interagency collaboration when a child is an alleged victim of child abuse or a crime witness. The Safehouse provides quality, child-sensitive forensic interviews in cases of alleged sexual abuse and referrals for interviews are accepted only from law enforcement agencies or the Children Youth and Families Department, Protective Services Division.
